

Division of Neuropsychology Center for Autism Spectrum Disorders



The multidisciplinary Center for Autism Spectrum Disorders (CASD) at Children's National Hospital in Washington, D.C., is currently recruiting a licensed neuropsychologist/psychologist with experience and training in Autism Spectrum Disorders. This position is a faculty appointment in the George Washington University School of Medicine involving responsibilities for clinical service and clinical and didactic training of neuropsychological/ psychological fellows and medical residents, interns, and doctoral students. All career levels are encouraged to apply.

CASD specializes in evaluation, treatment, and advocacy for children with autism spectrum disorders. Children of all ages are seen in multidisciplinary teams and treatment programs. Services are provided by psychology, neuropsychology, psychiatry, neurodevelopmental pediatrics, and speech and language pathology. CASD has an active research program with approximately \$2 million in funding annually. In addition to the development and evaluation of autism-specific treatments, CASD research focuses on: addressing disparities in care access by training community providers and delivering school-based interventions; the cognitive phenotype and neural basis of non-social challenges in autism; collaboration with autistic co-researchers; and investigating autism in females and transgender/gender diverse individuals. Active relationships exist with Georgetown and George Washington Universities and the National Institutes of Health.

Candidates must be license eligible in the District of Columbia and Maryland. Salary and benefits are competitive. Candidates should send a curriculum vita and 3 letters of recommendation to:
